HIGHLIGHTS FROM JUNE 13, 2006 BOARD MEETINGS

Zoning:

A hearing on the R5R Amendments has been postponed until July; The City Attorney is concerned that all residents must be notified. The variance ordinance passed by the State Legislature did not include the appropriate language for the issues concerning our area; another attempt will be made next year.

Streets, Public Safety & Utilities:

The City (including the storm water engineer and the public works department) are investigating the cause of bacteria in ocean water to see if it is caused by any storm water leaks. The contractor for the 43rd-49th Street project says they are near completion; trailer should be moved by the end of month. Concerning the new 61st Street pump station, the City will also review the 64th Street pump station with the goal of eliminating the 64th Street station. The Corps of Engineers indicates that the appropriate funding is not currently available for the 79th Street pump station but hopes it will be in next fiscal year's budget so work can begin next spring.

Beaches & Recreation:

The City will erect new red square flags every 5 blocks (42nd-87th Streets) warning of dangerous surf, riptides, etc. Beach police patrols will continue by all-terrain vehicles. A request will be made to the City that additional "keep off the dunes" signs be erected. If money is allocated by Congress sand replenishment will begin next spring.

Hospitality:

The committee has had several organizational meetings regarding our October 29th neighborhood party. Street captains are being assigned to sell tickets but volunteers are still needed from 82nd-87th Streets.

Resort Liaison:

Billy Almond agreed to be the chairman of this newly formed committee and be civic league's representative at the Resort Advisory Commission meetings.

WHEN CAN YOU SURF AT THE NORTH END?



While out in the water please remember the surfing regulations that are in effect Memorial Day Weekend through Labor Day Weekend:

- * Surfers must wear a leash when surfing (up to \$250 fine for not doing so).
- * Surfing is prohibited within 30 feet of the shoreline.
- * Monday – Thursday surfing is PERMITTED all day long.
- * Friday – Sunday you can ONLY surf BEFORE 11 AM and AFTER 4 PM.
- * If Red Flags are flying (indicating limited or no swimming) then surfing is permitted regardless of the time or day of the week.

DID YOU KNOW???



The Virginia Beach City Ordinances prohibit placing any type of sign on public property, such as the median between Atlantic Ave. and the feeder road, throughout the North End. Any sign is subject to removal and there is no requirement to return the sign. Therefore, FOR SALE/RENT, OPEN HOUSE, DIRECTIONAL SIGNS, GARAGE SALE, ETC. signs will more than likely be removed.



It is illegal to buy, sell, possess, transport or ignite any type of fireworks, including sparklers, anywhere in Virginia Beach.
