

TREASURER'S REPORT

As of June 8, 2010, there is \$1,539.96 in our checking account, \$18,433.22 in our money market account, and our certificate of deposit totals \$21,443.68. Total assets are currently \$41,416.86. LASKIN GATEWAY PROJECT

Martin Waranch and Billy Almond are representing the NVBCL on the Citizens Advisory Committee for the project. Below is the most recent construction update.

- Reopened by August 27: Arctic Avenue from 27th Street to 30th Street
- Closed from September 7 October 8: Holly Road Laskin/31st Street to 32nd Street

ZONING REVIEW COMMITTEE (ZRC)

The ZRC is working with developers on expansion/modifications of non-conforming uses. We know of four future projects that will be reviewed where the developer is renovating an older home and requesting to renovate/expand an existing secondary structure in the rear of the property. This was successfully done recently at 211-70th street and 203 – 69th Street which was supported by the adjacent residents and zoning committee. This is a new approach versus tearing down an older cottage with detached garage apartment and replacing with a big-box duplex. The ZRC feels this is a much better way to preserve the character of our neighborhood in light of the fact that there is no answer to "by-right" duplexes in our zoning district. Several members of the NVBCL ZRC met with the planning department on March 17th to discuss the process and next steps to modify our zoning ordinance to allow this type of re-development "by-right".

We are working towards establishing both the R5R zoning district between 50th Street and 89th Street, and the R7.5 zoning district between 42nd Street and 49th Street as a special overlay district. This special overlay would take the applicable sections of the Old Beach District Design Guidelines and synthesize them with our neighborhood. Several members of our zoning committee, along with a local northend developer, recently reviewed the Old Beach District Guidelines with the intent of merging these into our neighborhood. We have formulated our review and will be meeting with the City's Planning Department and City Attorney to continue the process. Stay tuned for updates about this great planning opportunity for our neighborhood.

GET READY TO PARTY!

61st STREET PUMP STATION

All four lanes of Atlantic Avenue will be open for traffic until October 1, 2010. Installation of the storm drain collection system along Atlantic Avenue will resume October 1st and will continue until May 15, 2011.

Work on the pump station site located in the median just south of 61st Street will continue throughout the summer. The feeder road will be closed to vehicular traffic between 60th and 61st Streets; pedestrian and bicycle access will be maintained. However, flaggers may need to stop pedestrian and bicycle traffic from time to time. Please be alert and pay attention to the construction signs when passing through the work area.

Work will continue throughout the summer months on the ocean outfall. Pipeline installation is currently in progress at the surf zone. North/south pedestrian access is in place above the high water line and directional signage is in place. The steel sheeting and work platform will advance ["leapfrog"] seaward during the summer months. The material rail trestle will remain in place until the pipeline is completed. Once the pipeline work advances past the surf zone the beach will be reopened along the shoreline, and a pedestrian access way will be constructed under the material rail trestle. A swimming and surfing restriction will be in effect 300 feet from the temporary steel work platforms and coffer cell.

INFORMATION YOU SHOULD KNOW

Please remember to call 911 if you see a crime in action. The non-emergency number is 385-000 to report crimes after they have occurred or to report any suspicious activity. Please call in any suspicious activity concerning graffiti or vandalism to cross walks, benches, etc. Police need description of individuals, car description if applicable, license number, etc.

A rip current is a seaward moving current that circulates water back to the sea after it is pushed ashore by waves and can pull people away from the shore. If caught in a rip current, remain calm and swim parallel to the shore until the pull stops. Then swim back in or tread water and wave for lifeguard assistance. Rip currents are most commonly found along jetties, piers and breaks in underwater sandbars. Few visible indicators are present.
