A NOTE FROM YOUR PRESIDENT

Lots to be thankful for this time of year. We have had one of the mildest winters in quite some time. Flowers are blooming, trees are budding and the robins have arrived right on time. As far as the north end is concerned, we are finally ending all the congestion problems from the installation of our new storm water pump station, drainage, and outfall system. From the few storms we have had, it appears that the system is doing as it was planned. This has been a long time coming and I look forward to not seeing cars stalled in the middle of Atlantic Ave. due to a flash storm that would render many sections of the north end streets impassable. My hats off to the city engineers for getting this project completed. I believe it will be worth the aggravation we all endured over the last couple of years. Dan Adams, the project manager for this new storm water removal system, will be our guest speaker on April 17th. Please bring questions you still have on this project, so that Dan can answer them for you.

Summer will be here before we know it and I would like to make it one of our goals to help alleviate some of the major parking issues we face every summer. We will try and pin point the worse sections of the north end where cars park on both sides of the street and feeder roads, and an emergency vehicle cannot pass through without having to find another way around. These few minutes could mean the difference in saving a life and we need to try and solve this issue. I know there are problems deeper into the neighborhoods concerning over crowded streets due to the ever increasing density problems, and we have been trying to find a solution to that as well. Please let one of the board members know if there is a particular section that falls into this category. It may mean only parking on one side of a particular street, but if that is what it will take to make it safe, we need to try. I hope we can all work together as a community to help solve this problem. We need your help and ideas, so please let's all work together.

In closing remember that safety is a prime concern and to watch out for bikers and joggers along the feeder roads. Many obey the laws and stop at all the intersections before proceeding, but many do not and no want wants to have that on their conscious if someone were to be hit. Be aware of your surroundings and report any suspicious activities. From break ins to grafiti, it all comes down to keeping a watchful eye out in our community.

TREASURER'S REPORT

As of the end of March, we have a total of \$34,559.28 in the checking, money market and CD's. Income from dues and donations is \$3,980.63. Expenses of \$5,251.20 are for the North End sign, newsletter and setting up the new web page and email list. Please check the mailing label to see if you have paid your \$15.00 dues for 2012.

BEAUTIFICATION

The City has completed its spring mulching of the median. The City has also pulled up all cactuses and many larger juniper beds due to rodents. They will be replaced with rose coreopsis and yaupon holly. The Landscaping Division is also in the process overseeing the removal of green mesh that was used several years ago to reseed the median. This mess is not biodegradable and remains in many median areas south of 64th Street.

Two separate contractors are currently in the process of tidying up their own disruption of median areas and all should be in order by Memorial Day.

The City is replacing the existing Scoop the Poop Stations with commercialgrade stands containing biodegradable bags. The city intends to replenish as needed. The large damaged planters at the east end of 64th Street will be removed".

STREETS, PARKING & UTILITIES

The annual North End Road Visibility survey will be done over the next few weeks. Line of sight is reviewed at the corner of every westbound street at the corners on Atlantic. Vegetation, fences and other structures are noted and the report is sent to the City for action. If you live at any of these corners and are aware of any limit to the "visibility triangle" required by traffic, please take action to correct the problem. The City will review all such obstacles and take remedial action for general safety.

The City's response to any complaints about lack of parking is to dust off their plan to pave the median. Your Civic league has fought that every time it has come up. It is incumbent upon all residents to ensure they do not impede public parking on the public right of way. Any resident installed signs to the contrary will be removed by the City.

With completion of the new pump station, the threat of major flooding will become history. However, minor flooding caused by blocked drains can be a hazard. Residents are urged to keep materials out of any storm drain. Good exercise and good neighborly to remove it yourself. Any major stoppage should be reported to the City for professional attention; call 385-4650.

BEACHES & RECREATION

The storm water project at 61st St. is on track for a March 25th completion. The city will assess penalties for delays past that. Atlantic Avenue work will be completed in March. The ocean outfall is nearly complete. Final work and testing should happen before the next meeting. They hope to have the "pier" removed and the dune at 61st St. repaired in time for planting of sea grass in April. Dominion Power will be restoring the forest of telephone poles to their original configuration with an expected completion date of May 1st. The city is setting up a contract to landscape the pump building in the media. This will dramatically reduce its impact. The city will be repaving Atlantic Avenue. This should be my last report on the storm water project.

Sand has been removed from the crosswalks. If there are any problems, please let me know. As discussed at the last meeting, the cost of planned sand replenishment this year was too high so the city will re-bid that project for next year.

Current Resort News

We continue to monitor the traffic alerts on the Laskin Road Gateway. All traffic updates are found on the city's web site. The Rudee Walk Project is funded and will start construction soon. This project connects the boardwalk to a sidewalk under the Rudee Inlet bridge to Winston Salem Avenue. A boat taxi launch is planned for the future to run visitors from the Rudee Bridge to the pier at the Virginia Aquarium. The Law Enforcement Memorial at 35th Street and the Boardwalk has begun and the dedication will be May 12th. There is a new committee formed to foster the redevelopment of 19th Street. The city is in the process of forming the redevelopment of 19th Street as a destination place including a Farmer's Market, Art Market and a "Green" destination. It will connect the Convention Center to the Oceanfront.

Zoning Review Committee (ZRC)

BZA Variances

We continue to monitor variance requests in our neighborhood. We see an increase in applications and building permits at the North End which is good news for the design and construction economies. We are monitoring a planning initiative at the North End that involves several lots within block in which the concept is to redevelop as a planned neighborhood vs. by-right development on individual lots. This has spurred interesting debate amongst the zoning committee. There will be a report out on this plan in the near future.

The ZRC hosted a community meeting regarding continuing redevelopment on 52nd - 53rd Streets on Thursday, March 22nd at 6:30 at the A.R.E. This was well attended and very informative meeting discussing all the zoning issues that have affected our neighborhood since the 1960s. All ZRC committee were present as were many residents from that neighborhood. We discussed the ZRC's past work and where we are today and how enlightened and energetic citizens can help make things happen. It is important to note that the "property owner" is the first person in any re-development scheme and should a particular street wish to control the type of redevelopment then those property owners need to work together to decide the outcome of their street. We will continue to look at options to guide redevelopment towards properly scaled residential development

We have also seen a number of new property owners saddled with illegal construction that occurred on their new residential site by a previous owner that affects their ability to expand now. Site feasibility and thorough due diligence is extremely important when purchasing a new home.
